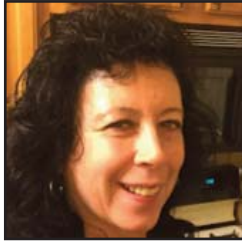

In May, they will be marching in the Maspeth's Memorial Day Parade.
