Suffolk Health Services Recognized for Leadership in Second Hand Smoke Project

SUFFOLK EAST DIVISION's Secondhand Smoke Education Project Chairman Walter Ladick, Jr., is shown here presenting Patricia Bishop-Kelly, Director of Public Information & Education of the Suffolk County Department of Health Services, with a plaque and a painting of Montauk Lighthouse expressing appreciation for her work in designing the workbook being used for the project. The workbook is used in hospital emergency rooms with children when they present with respiratory or ear infections and smoke is suspected as the cause. The Suffolk East Division is distributing 20,000 copies for use in nine hospitals and nine health centers on Eastern Long Island.

The project started with the encouragement of Glenn Hollins when he was Governor of the New York District. The presentation took place at the January divisional meeting hosted by the Three Village/Brookhaven Club.
