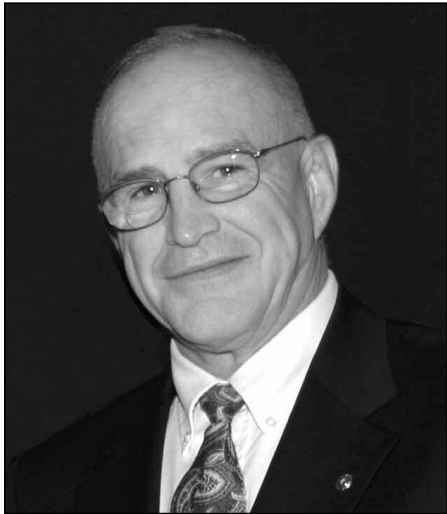

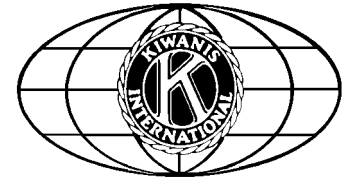
FRANCES HOGAN

She has been employed at the SIMHS, one of New York's largest and most respected providers of children's mental health services, since 1988. At the SIMHS, Ms. Hogan's responsibilities include acting as the agency's liaison to the community and to other social service organizations, directing the activities of the Society's more than 500 volunteers, and keeping her eye and her pulse on issues pertinent to the Society's mission of assisting children with special needs.

Prior to working in the not-for-profit field, Ms. Hogan was a teacher at Our Lady of Good Counsel School, St. Ann's School, and St. Christopher's School, all on Staten Island. She participated in and led a host of volunteer projects and activities at the schools.

She was also an active volunteer member of the Mental Health Society's Women's Guild, having served as president, secretary, chairperson of the International Spring Luncheon for two years, and chairperson of the Children's Party. In recognition of her service to the Guild and the SIMHS, she was presented with the Dorothy M. Kammer Volunteer Service Award in 1993.

Ms. Hogan's current volunteer activities include – **Kiwanis International**: Lt. Governor of the Metropolitan Division. In 2005, appointed to the Foundation Board as a behavioral consultant. Works with the Kaiser Program. For past five years has participated in the Kamp Kiwanis Work Weekend. In 2000, elected first female president of the Staten Island Kiwanis Club. **Staten Island Children's Campaign Charitable Trust**: Has been an officer of the Children's Campaign since its inception in 1991. **Staten Island Network of Volunteer Administrators (NOVA)**: Current vice president and past president.

Ms. Hogan also serves on the Staten Island Committee of United Way Executives; the Staten Island Children's Museum Circle of Friends Committee; the RSVP/SERVE Advisory Board; and the board of St. Peter's High School for Boys.

Ms. Hogan's past volunteer and professional affiliations include the Business and Professional Women's Club of Staten Island; Staten Island Institute of Arts and Sciences; Memorial Brick Program of the Notre Dame Alumnae Association; Board of the Seamen's Society for Children and Families, where she chaired the Society's House Tour Committee six times; Board of Community Resources for the Developmentally Disabled; Boy Scouts of America; Staten Island Communicators Guild; Staten Island Academy Education Committee; Pupil Personnel Services Advisory Committee to the District 31 Community School Board; and Friends of Boys Hope.

Ms. Hogan was named a Staten Island Advance Woman of Achievement in 1999 for her extraordinary volunteer service to the community.

In addition to the "Woman of Achievement" and "Dorothy Kammer" awards, she has been honored with the "Safe Harbor" Award from the Seamen's Society; the Soroptimist International Women of Distinction Award; the "Above and Beyond the Call" Award from United Way; the Literacy Advocate Award from the Staten Island Reading Association; the Junior Guild of Staten Island's Service Recognition Award; and the Women's Achievement Award from the Port Richmond Day Nursery.

A native Staten Islander, Ms. Hogan is a graduate of St. Peter's Girls High School and earned a BS in Education at Notre Dame College of Staten Island; she continues to be active in alumnae activities at each school. She resides in Westerleigh. Her son Peter lives in New Jersey.
