Please be advised that I have been told by Hyland Group, the insurance brokers for Kiwanis International, that the following changes have been made in both the Director's and Officer's Policies and the Crime Policy."

1. Effective 8/1/07 thru 11/1/07 - all clubs and foundations based in the United States that the D&O Program will no longer accept new applications for coverage. Thusly, if you are contemplating getting either the O&O, or the Crime Policy between these two dates, there will be no acceptance of application.
2. Additionally, clubs that do not have either of these coverage's will be allowed to purchase the coverage for 2007/2008 policy. This enrollment period will take place in November of this year.
3. Lastly, as you know D&O and Crime Policies have been issued for a two year policy term. Information on remitting payment for the second year; 11/1/07 thru 11/1/08 of coverage will be sent out later this summer.
