

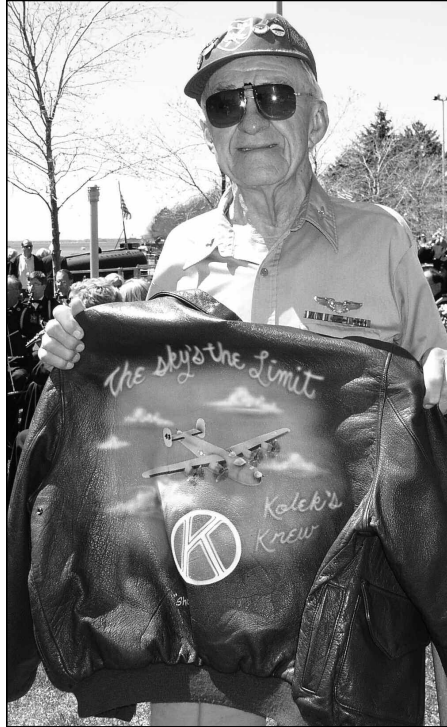
PG Edward Kolek Honored During Armed Forces Week

Kiwanis Past Governor Ed was honored for his service in W.W.II and continued work with our service men and women. Ed, a bomber pilot, was one of the first members of the United States Air Force when it was formed from the Army Air Corp. in 1947.

Jim is known in his home club as "Mr. Kiwanis" for his ability to mentor several members while participating in many community service projects.

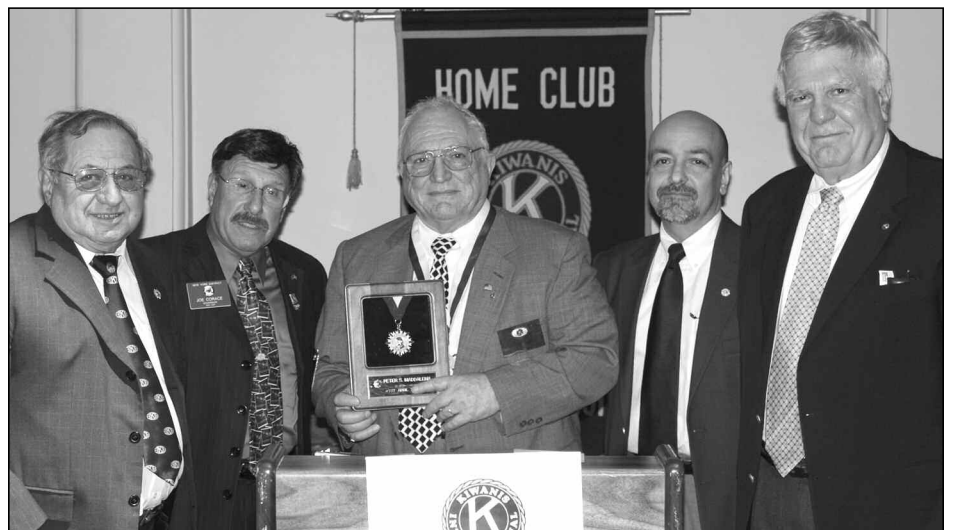
