KPTC Aligns with Level One Pediatric Trauma Centers

Covid has caused a "pause" on many things, but the impact of the Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Center Foundation (KPTC) continues unabated, thanks to the heroic work of its generous Kiwanis donors and two Level One Pediatric Trauma Centers located at Northwell's Cohen Children Medical Center's Safe Kids Program and at Stony Brook Children's Hospital, each receiving a \$40,000 grant from the KPTC Foundation.

KPTC heard stewardship reports from representatives from each hospital at its winter meetings. Preventive programs that save children's lives were presented by Northwell's Rosemary Ennis, EMT, MA, and Pediatric Surgeon Dr. Jose Prince. These include interactive videos, "Think First for Baby", Bicycle/Helmet Safety, Water

Safety, and a nationally recognized publication, The Center for Parent Education, Gazette, featuring an acknowledgment of the KPTC Foundation's financial support printed on its back cover.



Stony Brook representatives, led by its Development Director William Gehling and Pediatric Medical Director Dr. Richard Scriven, revealed that its Level One Pediatric Trauma Center won the Safe State Prevention Award for its Teddy Bear Classroom Video educating children and their parents about injury protection. They praised the

support of KPTC and the recent participation by Lindenhurst Key Club members in one of the Hospital's first "on-site" presentations of Stony Brook's Teddy Bear Clinic at Daniel Street Elementary School.

As a result of the KPTC's most recent \$40,000 grant to Stony Brook, the name of the KPTC Foundation will be placed on the \$100,000 Hospital Donor Wall later this year.


