HISTORY OF THE PEACH FESTIVAL

The original concept of the Peach Festival came from the first year in which the Kiwanis Club of Lewiston was formed – 1958.

The idea was developed as a means of honoring the Niagara County farmer and the bountiful crops, which are harvested each Fall. Charter members of our Club remember the days when Club members picked the peaches, and their wives peeled them for the famous Peach Shortcake dessert. Of course, as the Kiwanis Club grew, and requests for assistance from community organizations expanded, the Club needed to consider increased fund-raising events. The Peach Festival became the Club's main fundraiser.

Planning for the Peach Festival began earlier and earlier each year New events were added to the weekend festivities. The popularity of the Peach Queen contest in Niagara County later expanded to choosing a little girl and little boy as our Peach Blossom and Peach Fuzz. These individuals represent the Kiwanis Club at various events throughout the year, including parades and special activities.

The parade, which is always held on Saturday of the Peach Festival, has been a real success story. It attracts bands and parade groups from throughout Western New York, Pennsylvania and Southern Ontario. It ranks among the top festival-type parades in New York State. Long-time parade Chairman Jerald Wolfgang has been called upon for advice on several other parades due to his experience in this area.

The annual Peach Festival Fun Run was instituted in the 1970's. It has become a regular for dozens of runners from Western New York and Southern Ontario. Past President Tom Baia and volunteer Mimi Cacciatore instituted the run, from which the proceeds benefit various organizations in the area.

Another activity popular among area residents is the Peach Bake-Off. It was originally started by Joan Wolfgang, who chaired the event for ten years, and is sponsored by the Niagara Gazette. Many delicious recipes have been shared through this event.

Since 1991, the Festival kicks off Friday evening, with one of the events after opening ceremony being the cheerleading competition by various school teams. The cheerleaders are usually featured in the parade the following morning, Friday night also gives everyone a chance to try out the North American Midway Entertainment rides, as well as make the round of the game booths.

Another unique flavor of the Peach Festival is the involvement by many area civic organizations. Several community groups find that the Peach Festival Weekend offers them an opportunity to raise the majority of their funds for yearlong projects. Some of these include the Lewiston Service Guild, All Sports Boosters, Ransomville Lions Club, Lewiston-Porter High School Key Club, and other area Kiwanis Clubs.

Since 1958, the key to the success of the Peach Festival has been the core of volunteers, Kiwanians and their families, senior citizens and others interested in assisting the Club raise funds which ultimately filter back into the community.





WHAT IS KIWANIS?

Kiwanians are volunteers changing the world through service to children and communities. Kiwanis members help shelter the homeless, feed the hungry, mentor the disadvantaged and care for the sick. They develop youth as leaders, build playgrounds, raise funds for pediatric research and much more. No problem is too big or too small. Why? Because working together, members achieve what one person cannot accomplish alone. When you give a child a chance to learn, experience, dream and succeed, great things happen!

More importantly, what does it mean to have a Kiwanis Club in the Lewiston-Porter area? With a motto of "We Build", Lewiston Kiwanians are proud of a facility which is utilized by young and old, athletes and picnickers – Kiwanis Park. Through the fundraising in the early years, the development of Kiwanis Park was possible. Now with the help of public funding, the expansion and maintenance of the park makes it possible to improve the qual-

ity of life of many area residents.

The name "Kiwanis" means "we trade" or "we share our talents". It was coined from an American Indian expression, Nunc Kee-wanis. Kiwanians share their talents in the desire to improve our community. We can be found delivering Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets to the less fortunate. We ring bells for the Salvation Army, deliver flowers at Christmas and Valentine's Day Cards to shut-ins, sell newspapers for Make a Difference Day, sponsor the annual Easter Egg Hunt and Bike Rodeo and help children read. Through our annual Clam Bake, we provide funds to St. Mary's Hospital for the purchase of equipment and the D.A.R.E. program to educate children on the dangers of drugs and alcohol. We support Special Olympics through an annual bowling tournament and cooperate with the Volunteer Fire Company to provide services. We have collected over \$50,000 for Children's Hospital through the Block of Dollars.

The Kiwanis Club of Lewiston is proud of sponsoring a Key Club, Builders Club and K-Kids Programs at Lewiston-Porter Central School District as well as a K-Kids Program at the Tuscarora Indian School. We also sponsor the Niagara County Aktion Club which is for developmentally challenged adults

The Kiwanis Club of Lewiston is proud to have served the community since it was chartered on March 23, 1958. We currently have over 90 members dedicated to continuing the vision of its charter members. The Lewiston Kiwanis Peach Festival has raised over \$1.2 million and has served thousands of individuals over the years. We promise to continue to serve.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT Randy Gorzka




